Uniform Policy

Following feedback from families (and from the absolute bargains we had on sale at our #BlueTuesday event), we've made some changes to our <u>Uniform Policy</u> in a bid to keep our uniform accessible and affordable for families.

Uniform for 2024/25 is as follows:

- White polo shirt (school logo is optional)
- Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan (school logo is optional)
- Black, charcoal grey trousers or navy blue, skirt or pinafore
- Black waterproof shoes or plain black trainers
- (Velcro fasteners are preferred for children in F2 and Y1)
- Black, navy, white or grey tights
- Black, navy, grey or white socks

Or agreed PE kit is as follows:

- Plain white round neck t-shirt (logo optional)
- Plain black or navy blue zipped hooded top or their usual school jumper or cardigan.
- Plain black or navy jogging bottoms
- Suitable trainers for school sport (these can be your child's usual trainers, there is no expectation for parents to buy an additional pair of trainers for school sport)

Why do we wear school uniform?

During the last three years, we have worked very hard on our school identity and the feeling of belonging at Castleway. Our insistence on school uniform is a small, but important, part of who we are. Our school identity is one reason for why we ask our families to adhere to our affordable and accessible uniform policy but there are other reasons too.

• Equality and Inclusivity

When everyone is wearing the same clothing, it eliminates the pressure on families for children to wear expensive and trendy clothing to fit in with their peers. This promotes a sense of community and inclusivity, as everyone is part of the same team.

Improved Academic Performance

Studies have shown that school uniforms can lead to improved academic performance. When children are dressed in the same clothing, it reduces the pressure to conform to fashion trends and can help them focus on their learning. It can also improve their sense of belonging and create a more positive school environment. This is definitely what we have seen at Castleway since my arrival in April 2021.

• Time and Money Savings

School uniforms can also save families time and money. Instead of spending time each morning trying to decide what to wear, students can simply put on their uniforms and be ready for school. Additionally, uniforms are be less expensive than trendy clothing, and they can often be purchased in bulk or handed down from older siblings. We have worked hard on our uniform policy, including the recent changes, to ensure it is affordable and accessible.
